<p data-bbox="110 401 349 436">Learning Target</p> 	<p data-bbox="824 401 1430 436">Cite text evidence to support inferences</p> <p data-bbox="824 489 1503 709"><u>Evidence means</u> factual information <u>Text means</u> words, sentences, paragraphs <u>Cite means</u> using the text to prove you are right, writing it in quotations, and writing it exactly the way the original text is.</p>
<p data-bbox="110 1352 511 1388">How to Make an Inference</p> 	<p data-bbox="824 1388 1503 1528">Using clues to figure out what the author is NOT saying. Clues from the text plus what you already know creates an inference.</p> <p data-bbox="824 1570 1398 1606">Examples of how to start an inference sentence:</p> <ul data-bbox="873 1640 1073 1892" style="list-style-type: none">- "I think..."- "I predict..."- "My guess..."- "Maybe..."

<p>First, read the text.</p>	<p>Katy dropped off her things, then ran back to the pool to her designated chair. She climbed up the ladder and took her position for the day, where she would watch the park’s guests play in the water and look out for any people who might drown. Some days she would get bored watching the same people do the same things over and over again. The job was quite repetitive, but she received steady pay, something that allowed her to continue to live near her friends, family, and college.</p>
<p>Second, what do you already know based on your own experiences?</p>  <p>(continued from front)</p>	<p>What can you infer about Katy’s job? <i>I can infer that she is a lifeguard. She doesn’t like her job, but she works there so she can live where she wants to live.</i></p> <p>What can you infer about how Katy feels about where she lives? <i>She likes where she lives. She likes where she lives because she is close to her friends, family, and college.</i></p>
<p>Third, prove it! Cite text evidence. (You did this in fifth grade.)</p> 	<p>The text states, “She climbed up the ladder and took her position for the day, where she would watch the park’s guests play in the water and look out for any people who might drown.”</p> <p>Which inference does this prove? <i>This proves that she is a lifeguard.</i></p>
<p>Prove it! Cite text evidence.</p> 	<p>The text also states, “Some days she would get bored...”</p> <p>Which inference does this prove? <i>Katy probably doesn’t like her job.</i></p>

Lastly, the text states, "...she received steady pay, something that allowed her to continue to live near her friends, family, and college."

Which inference does this prove?

She likes where she lives.

Last, put it all together.

I think Katy works as a lifeguard at a waterpark. She thinks the job is boring, but she makes enough money so that she can live where she wants to live. **The text states,** "She climbed up the ladder and took her position for the day, where she would watch the park's guests play in the water and look out for any people who might drown." **The text also states,** "Some days she would get bored..." **Lastly, the text states,** "...she received steady pay, something that allowed her to continue to live near her friends, family, and college."

On this slide of the PowerPoint, why did I highlight some parts of this inference in green? Look closely. On this copy I have bolded the parts that are green on the slide.

There are a few reasons why these parts are important. What are those reasons?

Starting a sentence with I think is a way to write an inference.

Starting sentences with The text states is a way to write cited text evidence.

Cited text evidence must always be surrounded by quotation marks.

Three dots in cited text evidence indicates that there is more to the sentence that you have cited.
