The undersigned hereby expressly authorized the temporary guardians to have physical custody of said child; to exercise full control, discipline, and authority over said child; and to do and perform each and every act whatsoever necessary to be done as guardian and custody of said child, including (but not limited to) authorization and execution of consent for any and all medical and hospital care and treatment deemed necessary by a duly licensed physician for the health and well-being of said child and all matters involving the child's schooling and related education. It does not include the authority to consent to said child's marriage and adoption.

This instrument is to be in effect for a period of six months from date of execution unless revoked in writing. Two exceptions to the duration are children of parents in the military service for extended periods of time, and if the power of attorney from the court does not specify an expiration date. It is the intent of the parties that the transfer is done in accordance with Idaho Code Sections 15-5-104 and 33-1402 (10); and that the parties are free to enter into additional agreements.

PROPERLY EXECUTED POWER OF ATTORNEY
GRANTING CUSTODY OF A CHILD

A valid power of attorney must be filled out on the Power of Attorney form clearly showing the guardian's authority.

1. The power of attorney must be dated and signed by both parents if both are living; if divorced, by the parent having legal custody.
2. The power of attorney must be signed by the new guardians stating that they accept the power of attorney.
3. A power of attorney is only in effect for six months in the State of Idaho and must, therefore, be renewed upon expiration if needed to complete any given school year. Exceptions are as follows:
 - a. Military personnel serving outside of the territorial limits of the United States, for a period not exceeding twelve (12) months, may transfer care and custody matters of a minor child. The six (6) month limitation is not applicable in this case and the Power of Attorney form may be extended.
 - b. When a minor's care is delegated to a grandparent of the minor child, a sibling, or to a sibling of either parent, the powers shall continue in effect until the time, date, or condition set forth for automatic expiration of the power of attorney occurs. If the power of attorney does not specify a set date, period or condition for automatic expiration, the power of attorney shall continue in effect for a period of three (3) years.
4. This form must be filled out and presented to the building principal of the school to which the student will be attending.
5. The residence, for consideration of power of attorney issues only, will be considered the home, house, apartment or building where the legal guardians and child in question live at least five nights out of each week.
6. This occupying of the legal residence may be monitored or confirmed by the school resource officer (SRO), the school security officer, or school administration upon the receipt of a complaint, upon reasonable suspicion as to a differing residence and/or some type of discrepancy in the actual living situation and power of attorney, or in the situation of a power of attorney providing residence in an over-capacity school.
