

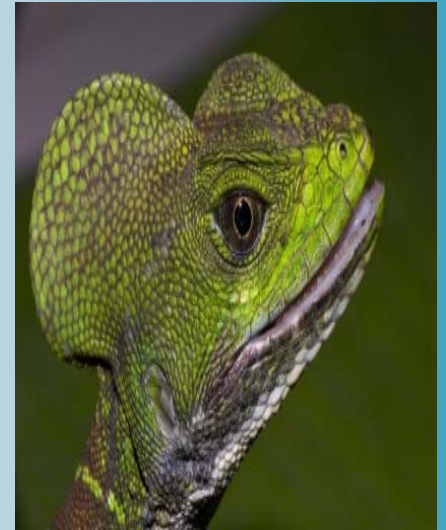
Adaptation
