



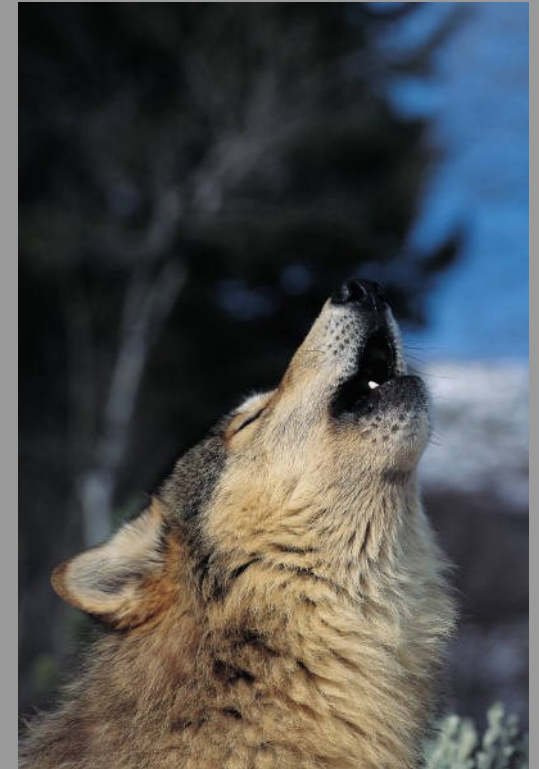

Characteristics

Wolves hunt in packs they do this to increase the chances in getting the prey. Also they can run over 35 miles an hour. Another characteristic is wolf pups are born deaf.

Human Interactions

Yes humans interact with wolves, just like trees do. Trees interact because they take in the bad air that we can't breath (carbon dioxide) into good air that we can breath. To look at each wolf they herd the wolves into a capture box that look like little dog houses with removable roofs. Then once it is in the box the volunteer veterinarian keeps doing the exam.

The wolf is on the endangered species list in some areas. They are giving people problems with farm animals. So people are killing the wolves. Sometimes even whole packs are killed at once. I think it is good that we interact with wolves because if we did not then we would not know as much as we do today.

Ecosystem

An ecosystem is a place that has living and nonliving things. People guess that about 7,000 to 12,000 wolves live in Alaska. They can live in a variety of habitats, including forests, grasslands, deserts, wetlands and tundra which are all wet except for the desert which is very dry.



Adaptations

One of the wolves adaptations is that the wolves feet are very wide, and the claws are sharp, so the fact that the claws are sharp helps provide traction, and the fact that the feet are wide helps them walk or run on top of the deep snow.
